# Meet the runners from this year's 1300 mile race

Women - 1300 Mile Race

Lenka Svecova - 28 Brno, Czech Republic Lenka has completed 15 ultras, including six multidays. In 2001 she reached her 1000 mile goal in 15 days 15 hours, which was a Czech women's national record. In 2000 she finished the 700 miler tied for second place in 11 days six hours. She ran 572 miles in the Ten day race in 2001. She finished fourth in 2000 in the six-day with 334 miles. Last year in the 1300 mile race she reached 863 miles before becoming ill with a viral infection. Lenka has a best of 375 miles for six days, and has run 163 miles for 48 hours, both Czech records.

# Svetlana Khisamoutdinova - 58 Smolensk, Russia

Svetlana reached 1015 miles in the 1300 mile race last year in her first attempt at the distance. In 2001 Svetlana finished the 1000 mile race in 16 days 01 hours, becoming the oldest finisher of that event at that time. Svetlana has run 15 ultras in the last few years, including 382 miles for six days, as well as 872 miles in the 1000 mile race in 2000. She was a former professor of physical culture at Smolensk Institute, and was also a champion speed skater in earlier years.



Ashprihanal Aalto - 32 Helsinki, Finland One of the best endurance runners in the world, Ashprihanal returns to attempt the elusive 1300 miler. He is ranked second all-time for 3100 miles (46 days 13 hours), has won the 700 mile race three times with a best of 9 days five hours, and has won the 3100 race two times (2000 and 2001). Ashprihanal has emerged victorious in the Six Day Race for the last two years as well, winning each race with supreme efforts on the last day. He has also hiked the Appalachian Trail and the Pacific Crest Trail in solo fashion, covering over 37 miles per day for up to eight weeks. Ashprihanal works as a courier and delivery man back in Helsinki.

### Rainer Koch - 22 Dettelbach, Germany

The youngest starter in the history of the race, Rainer is determined to do well. He has run 203 km for 24 hours, 8:20 for 100 km, and participated in the 18 day Trans Gaule stage race in France. He has 2:52 marathon speed as well.









### 1000 Mile Women Runners

Women - 1000 Mile Race

### Paula Mairer - 44 Salzburg, Austria

Last year Paula broke two long-standing records for women, setting new world bests at 1000 km (7+16:08:37) and 700 miles (8+15:34:13). In 2001 Paula broke the women's world record for 1300 miles by completing the distance in 17 days 21 hours, nearly an hour and a half under the record. Her split for 1000 miles (13 days 17 hours) ranks second alltime. Paula won the 1000 miler for the women in 2000 in 14 days 12 hours, the only finisher of that race. In 1999 in her first attempt she finished 1000 miles in 17 days, two hours, during Hurricane Floyd. A few years earlier she finished the 700 miler on two occaisons.

## Tina Bercic - 30 Ljubljana, Slovenia

In 2002, Tina finished second in the 1000 miler with 847 miles. Tina completed the 700 mile race in 2000 tied for second place in 11 days six hours. That was her multiday debut. She has done 397 miles for six days and 599 for ten days, among her 12 ultramarathons.

## Kaneenika Janakova - 33 Bratislava, SLK Kaneenika ran a personal best for 700 miles last

year in 10 days+19:52:05, placing third overall, and ahead of the men. She finished second in the 700 mile race in 2001, finishing in 11 days 12 hours. She has a best of 406 miles for six days, a Slovakian record. In 2000 she ran 364 miles in her first six day event. She has been running for eight years, with ten ultras and four multidays to her credit.

## Maria Horvath - 38 Zalaegerszeg, Hungary This spring Maria ran 504 miles in the Ten Day Race. She has a best of 348 miles for the six

days. She has run seven ultras in nine years of running.









## 1000 Mile Men Runners

Men - 1000 Mile Race

Don Winkley - 65 Corpus Christi, Texas, USA
Don returns to New York in a new age group. In
1997 he set an American age group record (5559) for 1000 miles in 14 days 10 hours. At the
time this was a masters world best for the
distance. 1995 he became the oldest finisher of
the Moonbat Trans America Race (2925 miles)
finishing tenth and completing all 64 stages. In
1994 he set an American six day age group (5559) record of 450 miles. In the Inaugural Sri
Chinmoy Ten Day Race in 1996, Don finished
fifth with 600 miles. He won the race overall the
following year. He has run in many countries,
including stage races across France, across
Europe, and across the deserts of Australia.

### Tsvetan Tsekov - 22 Sofia, Bulgaria

The youngest competitor of this race, Tsvetan won the 700 miler last fall for the men in 11 days 18 hours. This spring in the Ten Day, Tsvetan finished second with 622 miles, a personal best. In a brief run ning career of six years, Tsvetan has run five multidays.

Pranam Horlbeck - 35 Zurich, Switzerland Last year in the 1000, Pranam reached 780 miles. He finished sixth in the 700 mile race in 2001, completing the distance in 11 days 21 hours. He has run five multidays in seven years of running.

# **Chanakhya Jakovic - 49 Jamaica, New York, USA**

In 2002, Chanakhya completed 642 miles for his furthest distance covered in any race. In 30 years of running, Chanakhya has run over 30 ultras, including 18 multidays. He has a best of 303 miles for six days, and in 2000 ran 623 miles during the 1000 mile race.

Martin Milovnik - 31 Bratislava, Slovakia
Martin finished second with 870 miles in the
1000 Mile Race last year, his third attempt at the
distance. He ran 852 miles in the 1000 Mile
Race in 2001 and 850 miles in 2000. He
completed 580 miles in his multiday debut in the
10 Day Race in 2000. He has run over 15 ultras
in his brief running career.











### 700 Mile Runners

#### Women - 700 Mile Race

Dipali Cunningham - 45 Melbourne, Australia Dipali is one of the world's best women ultradistance runners. She has won 14 of the 17 multiday events she has entered since 1992, including three overall victories. In the spring of 2001 she set a new women's world record on the road for six days with 510 miles, defeating all the men in that race. In 2001 she ran 700 miles in 9 days 11 hours, the third fastest all-time for women. She has completed the 700 mile race eight times. In 1998 she set a women's world best on the road for six-days with 504 miles, despite heavy rains at Wards Island Park. In 1999 she won the 700 mile race overall in 10 days, 21 hours. She is ranked third in the world for 700 miles, and third for 1000 miles, having dominated the women's 1000 mile race in 1997 in 13 days, 20 hours. She has won all six Sixday titles in our spring-time event. She likes shorter, faster races as well, having won the Sri Chinmoy 47 Mile Invitational 17 times for the women.

Beatrice Boesch - 50 Basel Switzerland In 19 years of running, Beatrice has run 31 ultras and six multidays, including several 48 hour and 24 hour races. Thjis will be her first attempt at 700 miles.

#### Men - 700 Mile Race

Tibor Malits - 31 Szekesfehervar, Hungary In 2001 Tibor finished the 700 mile race in fifth place, completing the distance in 11 days, 13 hours. In 10 years of running, Tibor has completed over 33 ultras, including five 24 hour races and two 48 hour races among his ten multidays. He ran 564 miles in the ten day, good for fourth place for the men. In 2000 he ran 527 miles in the 700 mile race, his first stab beyond six days.

## Luis Rios - 55 Brooklyn, NY USA

Last year Luis ran 627 miles, the furthest he has gone in a multiday race. A fixture at all shorter ultras in the New York area, Luis has had a long and prolific running journey. He has completed over 200 ultras, including a best at 24 hours-140 miles, and several fast 100 milers to his credit. He has done seven multiday events, with a best of 421 miles for six days. He ran 525 miles in the Ten day race in 2001. This spring he totaled 525 miles again in the Ten-Day event as a warm-up for this race.

# **Christopher Muellauer - 31 Zurich, Switzerland**

Christopher M. also debuted this spring at multiday running, reaching 328 miles in his first attempt at six days on the road.











Christopher Rana - 26 Hamburg, Germany
This spring Christopher ran 334 miles in the Six
Day event, his first multiday attempt. He has
been running for four years.
